Introduction

Procedure

Activity Day 1:

1. Review locating theme in a reading passage.
2. Discuss how themes help to develop stories.
3. Introduce "The Scholarship Jacket" by Marta Salinas.
4. Require students to read the text and jot down themes that are introduced in the story as they read.
5. Group students in groups of 3 or 4 and have them discuss the themes that are found in the story.
6. Have each group report out their findings to the class.

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
