Procedure

- 1. Have a class discussion about the Civil War. Discuss how enslaved people played an active role in their own emancipation as well as discuss the Emancipation Proclamation and how it came to fruition.
- 2. Discuss how some emancipated slaves stayed south around their own neighbors while others fed north and became wage laborers.
- 3. Have students f II out a graphic organizer detailing what they think they would have done if they were a freed slave after the Civil War. Have students write down where they would go: south, where they knew their environment or north, where they didn't know what the weather would be like or if they could f nd a job.
